Getting Here:

Located in sunny North Central Washington, here's how to get to Okanogan Country.

From the Seattle/Tacoma Area:

A) Take I-90 to Snoqulamie Pass, Cle Elum then take exit 85 for WA-970 to Wenatchee.
B)Take I-5 North to Everett or Hwy 522 to Monroe. Follow Stevens Pass, Hwy 2, east to Wenatchee.
Then Continue on Hwy 2 following signs to East Wenatchee/Okanogan, crossing the Columbia River. Take Hwy 97 north (turn left at the junction) and continue north to Pateros, the southern gateway to

Alt. Route: North Cascades Hwy (closed in winter): Take I-5 North to Burlington and follow the signs to Hwy 20. Follow the Cascades Scenic Byway through Sedro-Woolley and continue as you travel through North Cascades National Park and Ross Lake National Recreation Area before dropping down into Mazama and Winthrop, the entryway to the scenic Methow Valley and Okanogan Country.

From Spokane:

Okanogan Country.

From Spokane, take Hwy 2 west towards Davenport. Just past Wilbur, turn north on Hwy 174 towards

Grand Coulee Dam. At the junction, take Hwy 155 north towards Elmer City, Nespelem, and Omak, or continue west to travel towards Bridgeport, Pateros, and the Methow Valley.

From Kelowna, BC:

From Kelowna, BC, follow the signs for BC-97 south to Osoyoos. Just past Osoyoos on BC-97, cross the US/Canadian border and continue on Hwy 97 to Oroville, the northern gateway to Okanogan Country.

REGIONS: Methow





From the North Cascades to the **Methow and Columbia Rivers**, the Methow Valley's scenic beauty offers plenty of recreational and cultural opportunities. Here you will find some of the **world's best cross-country skiing**, hiking and mountain biking, local organic farming, galleries, theater and live music.

WINTHROP Back country skiing, boardwalks and cowboy boots, and big cowboy hats thrive in the Old West town of Winthrop, but you'll also find wine tasting, shopping and dining. Don't miss the Balloon Roundup in March or the famous 49er Days in May. Explore the Shafer Historical Museum's famous outdoor replica pioneer village, wander the boardwalks and take the time to experience Winthrop's two walking bridges, one north and one on the south edge of downtown.

TWISP In the heart of the Methow Valley, Twisp is home to musicians, thespians, painters, sculptors, and glass, metal and fabric artists. Enjoy live theater at the Merc Playhouse and art exhibits at the Confluence Gallery and Twispworks. For great food and cool brews, stop by a local brewery. On seasonal Saturdays, don't miss the famous Methow Valley Farmers Market right off the main highway. As the summer heats up, take a dip in the Wagner Pool and enjoy the Twisp Park, at the confluence of the Twisp and Methow Rivers. Up the Twisp River Recreation Area find numerous trails for outstanding hikes and camping. Visit the Methow Valley interpretive Center to learn about the cultural and natural history of the Methow Valley.

THE GREAT OUTDOORS For the outdoor enthusiast, the Methow Valley is a fantastic base for









exploring the **North Cascades National Park** or the half-million acre **Pasayten Wilderness**. Autumn brings deer hunting season, and fishing in the Methow River or many of the streams and lakes is a popular pastime year-round.

NORDIC SKIING DESTINATION Ski on the largest cross-country ski trail system in North America with Methow Trails. The snow quality and grooming of the trails is the best in the nation and draws athletes from around the world. With over 200km of groomed trails and hut-to-hut skiing you'll find a trail for every age and skill level. Fat bike, dog-friendly, kids 17 & under FREE.

MORE WINTER ADVENTURES Alpine skiing, snowboarding, Nordic skiing and tubing for all ages are a short drive away at the Loup Loup Ski Area, a fantastic family ski area with a 1,240 vertical drop and a quad chair lift. For the snowmobilers, the Methow offers 450 miles of groomed trails and many snoparks. Heli-skiing rewards the truly adventurous with unsurpassed snow. Everyone will enjoy ice skating at Winthrop's outdoor ice rink.

UNIQUE SPOTS Spring is a time of extravagant beauty as the wildflowers bloom. The best view is while running **Methow Trail's Sunflower Relay!** Don't forget the annual **Ride to Rendezvous,** as horses, mules and stagecoaches ride through Twisp every spring on their way to the famous **49ers Days in Winthrop.** Learn about the history of smokejumping and take a guided tour of the birthplace of smokejumping at the **North Cascade Smokejumper Base** south of Winthrop.

KIDS & PETS The Weather Channel declared the Methow as the number one place in the nation for family vacations! In Winthrop, tromp the wooden boardwalks, play mini golf and check out the ice cream shop and bakery. There are many easy well maintained trails that are perfect for the family. Some, like Falls Creek, Blackpine Lake, Rainy Pass Trail and the Washington Pass Overlook are designed for wheelchair and stroller access.










REGIONS: Heart of the Okanogan




Warm summers, mild winters, working ranches, real cowboys and American Indians, and a rich agricultural heritage combine to create the Heart of the Okanogan.

OKANOGAN The City of Okanogan maintains the flavor of yesterday. Take a self guided walking tour downtown and enjoy murals of renowned 19th century photographer Frank Matsura displayed on the town's historic buildings.


OMAK Omak is home to the annual Omak Stampede and World Famous Suicide Race, always the second weekend in August. An Indian encampment held during the Stampede draws tribal members from around the country for dancing, drumming, and competition. Downtown Omak boasts a self-guided Main Street Historical Tour of murals and history.

CONCONULLY Conconully offers true "from your door" snowmobiling and ATV-ing, hunting and fishing. Conconully Museum focuses on the area as it was at the turn of the century and features everyday living including mining and ranching. The Spring/Fall Cattle Roundup in Conconully includes a cattle drive through town. Conconully State Park is a treasured destination for sportsmen and families.

THE GREAT OUTDOORS You'll find boating, water sports, horseback riding, camping, golfing, fishing and hiking here. At night, take a moment to look up and admire the stars...folks from around the world swear they are brighter here than anywhere else. Access the Pasayten through Conconully for hiking, mountain biking, snowmobiling and wilderness adventures.









FAIRS & RODEOS The Okanogan County Fair and Rodeo in September is a "don't-miss" event. Enjoy music, food, rodeo, horse racing and carnvial. Before you leave, stop by the 4-H and FFA barns to see animals proudly shown by local youngsters.

ARTS & CULTURE Omak Performing Art Center in Omak is a county-wide destination for the performing arts. The Okanogan County Historical Museum and Firehall Museum Complex in Okanogan take you back in time with an old-fashioned main street, settler's cabin, and a display of apple industry history.

In Omak's **Eastside Park** a sculpture collection depicts the American Indian legend of "**How the Animals Got Their Names.**" A variety of artists participated in this installment made possible by the **Colville Tribal Artists' Association.**

In January, enjoy Conconully's famous **Outhouse Races.** The three-person teams consist of a 'rider' and two 'pushers,' and the results are guaranteed hilarious.

UNIQUE PEOPLE & PLACES In 1903, Frank Matsura, a Japanese immigrant, arrived in the area as a cook's helper. He became a beloved member of the community and world-renowned photographer, recording the frontier era and NativeAmerican heritage. The Okanogan County Historical Society houses many of Matsura's photographs and a replica of his studio.

The historic **Cariboo Trail** runs from southern Canada to the Columbia River. A major trade route throughout its history, it first was used for fur trade, then later for the Canadian gold rush.

KIDS & PETS The **Eastside Park** in Omak has playground equipment, ball courts, dog parks, sports fields, camping and RV park, trails and a swimming pool. In **Okanogan**, **Alma Park** has a swimming pool, picnic area, playground equipment and sports field.


The North Okanogan is a geological jewel and a secret treasure to hosts of outdoor adventurers (both motor and muscle powered), as well as nature lovers and history buffs. It includes the Many Lakes Region on the west side of the Okanogan River and the Okanogan Highlands on the east side. The Many Lakes Loop Map will guide you through this area of both remote and easily accessible lakes and trails, providing excellent fishing, hiking and camping. Drive the Highland Historic Loop and discover a land rich in farming, mining and logging history. From the Okanogan River valley up through open grasslands and forested mountains, this route includes a variety of ghost towns, scenic views, trails and fishing lakes.


TONASKET: Tonasket has an abundance of antique shops, a great selection of restaurants, parks and opportunities for hiking, biking, climbing, fishing and water sport adventures. The visitor's information center (and gallery) is located on the main street beside Founder's Park and the district office for the Forest Service is at the north end of town.

OROVILLE: A few miles south of the 24-hour Canadian border crossing, Oroville has an abundance of historic and recreational opportunities - with Molson and Chesaw to the east and Nighthawk (a small 9 to 5 border crossing) and Palmer Lake and Loomis to the west. Oroville has the distinction of being the mid-point of the 1200 mile Pacific Northwest Trail (PNT).

REPUBLIC: Forty miles east of Tonasket on Hwy 20, Republic was known as "Eureka Gulch" in 1896, and a prolific gold mining town for 100 years, Republic is home to the Stonerose Interpretive Center. Here you can explore and dig your own fossils from the 50 million-year-old Boot Hill Fossil Site.









THE GREAT OUTDOORS: The Pasayten Wilderness Area and Sinlahekin Fish and Wildlife Preserve (with the state's most diverse butterfly population) are located near Loomis. Don't miss a great hike, climb, or bike ride at McLaughlin Canyon, Whistler Canyon, or the Similkameen Trails. The fishing is extraordinary, and each lake has its own fishing requirements. Current regulation at www.wdfw.wa.gov or stop at the Tonasket or Oroville Visitor Information Centers.

FAIRS AND RODEOS: The annual Chesaw 4th of July Rodeo is an old fashion family event. They ride cows in Chesaw and you can too! The Tonasket Founder's Day celebration includes a parade, family BBQ, and rodeo (1st weekend after Memorial Day). At the spring and fall Okanogan Family Faires (near Tonasket) you will find folks trading goods, playing music, sharing arts and crafts, dancing and singing.

ARTS AND CULTURE: The Old Oroville Depot Museum is the original train depot, built in Oroville in 1907 and the largest Great Northern Rail Road depot building still in useable condition in the Pacific Northwest. The Old Molson's Ghost Town and School Museum is a great place for a walk back in time, don't miss the old pioneer buildings, farm machinery, mining equipment and other historic artifacts.

UNIQUE PLACES AND EVENTS: Tonasket's Okanogan River Garlic Festival is a celebration of the harvest with gourmet foods, produce, arts and crafts and entertainment in August. In January, while the ice is still on the lake catch some fish and you are sure to win a prize at the Molson's NW Winter Ice Fishing Festival.

KIDS AND PETS: The new Tonasket Water Ranch is open and is a great stop for cooling off the kids. Another great idea is to stop for a swim at Oroville's Deep Bay Park on Lake Osoyoos.












REGIONS: Columbia River Area



The Columbia River Region stretches along the Columbia River from Pateros to the Grand Coulee Dam Area. It includes fascinating geological features, the Colville Indian Reservation and unsurpassed recreational opportunities.

PATEROS Pateros was originally established as Ives Landing around 1896 by Lee Ives when he began farming near the confluence of the Methow and Columbia Rivers and built his landmark hotel on the banks of the Columbia. Today, Pateros is a vibrant community with parks, picnics, swimming areas, fruit stands with fresh local fruit, fishing and dining. Take a walk along the river, watch the hydroplane or Jet Ski races, take part in the Apple Pie Jamboree in July, or get in some incredible salmon and steelhead fishing.

BREWSTER Brewster's location at the confluence of the Okanogan and Columbia Rivers has made it a gateway to the vast lands of the north since before Astor's Pacific Fur Company established the first American inland fur trading post nearby. On the way to Bridgeport, the newly-built Gamble Sands Golf Course and Resort, designed by famous Scottish architect David McLay Kidd, is a destination in its own right.

BRIDGEPORT Nestled between beautiful hills along the Columbia River, Bridgeport's most prominent feature is the Chief Joseph Dam, which creates a fabulous fishery in the Rufus Woods Lake immediately behind the dam.

GRAND COULEE DAM AREA This engineering marvel is nearly a mile across, over 500 feet tall and flows into the Pacific Ocean. The mighty dam harnesses the power of over **six trillion gallons** of water, sending clean hydro power into eleven states. **Guided tours** are provided free of charge at the dam and check out the **laser light show** every night in summer on the face of the dam. Epic events include the **Banks Lake Triple Fish Challenge**,









Colorama Festival, Koulee Kid's Fest, 4th of July Festival of America, Harvest Fest, and Vintners & Brewers Tasting & Auction!

COLVILLE CONFEDERATED TRIBES The Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation was established in 1872 and covers 1.4 million acres in Okanogan and Ferry Counties. Lands are diverse with natural resources including timber, streams, rivers, minerals, native plants, and wildlife. The **Colville Tribal Museum,** located in Coulee Dam, provides a glimpse of the rich heritage of the people with historical displays of early Indian settlements, history and lifestyles of the twelve bands that comprise the Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation. The **4th of July Pow Wow** is the Tribes largest cultural event and attracts the best singers and dancers throughout Indian Country. Stick games and a parade accompany the celebration. Early spring features the **Sun Flower Festival** at Paschal Sherman Indian School and an Indian Encampment is held the 2nd weekend of August during the Omak Stampede & World Famous Suicide Race in Omak. Colville Tribal Casinos is pleased to present their newest property the 12 Tribes Resort Casino located in Omak, open now. Featuring a 56,000 square foot gaming floor with slot machines & table games, two restaurants, a lounge, a spa, an indoor pool, an indoor/outdoor sauna and an 80 room hotel with 12 luxury suites.

FORTHE KIDS Fishing, camping, boating, museums, festivals and events will ensure that your children are never bored! Pateros Park welcomes pets and has a long walking trail along the river. Rivers Restaurant serves world-famous beef from the Double R Ranch, and the Sweet River Bakery in Pateros has incredible pizza and baked goods! Grand Coulee hosts the Colorama Festival in May: a festival, rodeo, parade, carnival, and hours of family activities, and the Koulee Kids Fest on the Saturday before Father's Day: free fun for kids including mini golf, fishing, paddle boats, coloring contests, and free entertainment. The Brewster City Pool has two waterslides, two diving boards, and is right next to the Brewster City Park. Between Brewster and Bridgeport, the Fort Okanogan Interpretive Center is open during the summer and free to the public, with dioramas and events during the summer. (509) 689-6665.







Conconully State Park • 81-acre camping park with lake, shade trees, and maintained lawns. From Hwy 97, west on Johnson Creek Rd, continue 6.5 miles. North onto Conconully Rd & drive 11 more miles. (The only state park within city limits!)

Scotch Creek Wildlife Area • 10 miles northeast of Omak and Okanogan on Conconully Hwy, 9,067 acres.

Tunk Creek Wildlife Area • From Omak, drive N to Riverside, turn right, cross Okanogan River, then left onto Tunk Valley Rd, 15 miles to sign. 1,080 acres.









NORTH OKANOGAN

Sinlahekin Wildlife Area • 5 miles S of Loomis or 4.5 miles NE of Conconully, 14,000 acres. More butterfly species than anywhere in the state, plus deer, bighorn sheep, moose, black bear, cougar, waterfowl, more. From Riverside, north on SR 97 to Mile Post 304.6. Turn left on South Pine Creek Rd for 7 miles.

Whistler Canyon • A best bet for wildlife viewing. The area boasts the largest band of Bighorn Sheep, plus wild Turkeys, Mule Deer, Chucker, Grouse, and an occasional bear can been seen near the trailhead and rocky bluffs. Part of the Pacific Northwest Trail, go 3 miles south of Oroville off state Highway 97.

COLUMBIA RIVER REGION

Bridgeport Bar • Near the mouth of the Okanogan River, 450 acres of wetlands and ponds. Waterfowl, Bald eagles, American white pelicans, long-billed curlews and Sandhill cranes, California quail, Ring-necked pheasants and grey partridge occur on the area.

Indian Dan Canyon • 4,412 acres northeast of Brewster. Shrubsteppe habitat occurs extensively on this unit, providing habitat for sharp-tailed grouse, white-tailed jackrabbit, sage and Brewer's sparrows, mule deer, white-tailed deer and other wildlife.

Chelan Ridge • Raptors, migratory birds. Copper Mountain. From Pateros, travel up Hwy 153 7 mi, left on Black Canyon Rd. Drive 9 miles to T-intersection with road No. 8020, turn left, travel 3.6 miles to the Chelan Ridge Raptor Migration project.

Lake Roosevelt National Recreation Area • Bald eagle, bear, elk, bobcat, raptors, waterfowl.

Rufus Woods Lake • 51 miles long between Grand Coulee Dam and Chief Joseph Dam; wildlife viewing and birdwatching.

HUNTING INFORMATION

Hunting opportunities—ranging from upland game birds and waterfowl to big game—abound in Okanogan Country. Thousands of acres of federal and state public lands make the area one of the West's premier venues for rifle, black powder and shotgun enthusiasts as well as for bow hunters. Our vast public lands offer an amazing variety of animals. Big game species include mule deer, whitetail deer, bear, elk, moose, bighorn sheep, mountain goat and cougar. Small game includes bobcat, coyote, fox, raccoon, lynx, badger, beaver, rabbits and hare.

With over 600 lakes, North Central Washington provides some of the best bird hunting in the Pacific Northwest. Migratory waterfowl and upland game bird species include pheasant, wild turkey, grouse, quail, chukkar, ptarmigan, goose and duck.







Upper Columbia River Region Highlights

The mighty **Columbia River** flows through Okanogan Country and creates some of the state's best fisheries and water recreation opportunities. The famous Grand Coulee and Chief Joseph Dams create lakes along the river's path, and the waters of the Columbia fill Banks Lake as well. Each of these lakes offer year-round fishing and also create recreation destinations featuring water access, boating and jetskiing, parks, campgrounds, and golfing.

Rufus Wood Lake—Located upstream of Chief Joseph Dam, Rufus Woods Reservoir is 51 miles long with a year-round open season including trout and kokanee, walleye, yellow perch and smallmouth bass. There is a state park with camping and boat launching facilities, two nearby golf courses (Gamble Sands and Lakewoods Golf Course) and an Army Corps of Engineers hunting access area with boat launch. Free tours. www.corpslakes.com

Banks Lake—Banks Lake is a 27-miles-long, mile-wide reservoir formed by the North Dam near Grand Coulee and the Dry Falls Dam near Coulee City and is filled with water from Lake Roosevelt (part of the Columbia River). Most of the shoreline is ringed with basalt cliffs and talus slopes, rocky outcrops and shrub-steppe habitat. There are about 23 islands in the reservoir from one to several acres in size. Steamboat Rock, in the northern part of the lake, has varied wildlife, fishing galore, and birdwatching opportunities, including common loons, bald eagles, mule deer and peregrine falcons.

Lake Roosevelt—The upper Columbia River gorge, within which Lake Roosevelt is a national recreation area spanning three areas: the Okanogan Highlands, the Kootenay Arc, and the Columbia Plateau, each of them featuring completely distinct geographic features and creating an incredibly diverse region. Lake Roosevelt Reservoir was created in 1941 by the completion of Grand Coulee Dam. Includes 130 miles of water, 27 campgrounds, 22 boat launches, 10 swim beaches, and historical sites such as Fort Spokane Visitor Center and Museum and St. Paul's Mission. Lake Pateros —Located upstream of Wells Dam, this twenty (20) mile long reservoir contains a variety of fish species, but it is noted for steelhead, summer chinook, and sockeye salmon fisheries. Largemouth bass, smallmouth bass and walleye are also available.

The Grand Coulee Dam—At an awe-inspiring span of 5,223 feet, the Grand Coulee Dam is the largest concrete structure and largest electricity-producing facility in the United States. North America's largest outdoor laser light show is projected nightly onto the face of the Dam from Memorial Day through the end of September, and a Fourth of July pyrotechnic show is launched every year from its top. A Visitor Information Center at the Dam offers information and free tours.

Wildlife Areas

Bridgeport Bar • Near the mouth of the Okanogan River, 450 acres of wetlands and ponds. Waterfowl, Bald eagles, American white pelicans, long-billed curlews and Sandhill cranes, California quail, Ring-necked pheasants and grey partridge occur on the area.

Central Ferry Canyon • The Central Ferry Canyon Unit encompasses 1,908 acres of land located southwest of Brewster. Shrubsteppe habitat occurs extensively on this unit, providing habitat for sharp-tailed grouse, white-tailed jackrabbit, sage thrasher, sage and Brewer's sparrows, mule deer and other wildlife.

Indian Dan Canyon • 4,412 acres northeast of Brewster. Shrubsteppe habitat occurs extensively on this unit, providing habitat for sharp-tailed grouse, white-tailed jackrabbit, sage and Brewer's sparrows, mule deer, whitetailed deer and other wildlife.

West Foster Creek • The West Foster Creek unit's 1,050 acres lie south of and adjacent to the Bridgeport Unit of the Sagebrush Flat Wildlife Area in Douglas County. Its shrubsteppe habitat supports sharptailed grouse, white-tailed jackrabbit, sage thrasher, sage and Brewer's sparrows, mule deer and other wildlife species.

HISTORICAL SITES

- **S1 Nighthawk Historic Townsite** The Nighthawk Hotel, original schoolhouse, a mining office and old mill are all still standing.
- **S2** Old Oroville Depot Museum Old Depot Museum features the first railroad in Okanogan County in 1905. Displays in the main room change each year and always offer something of interest. Travel back through the log cabin that was built in 1894.
- **S3** Loomis Once called "Loomistown", this was another of the great Okanogan mining towns, including eight saloons and two dance halls.
- **S4** Conconully Museum In 1889, Conconully was the county seat, and a beacon for prospectors all over the west. Learn more at the Conconully Museum and Matsura City Park.
- **S5** Ruby Townsite Ruby City was one of the most famous mining towns in the Northwest and was the county seat for 11 months. Today, stone foundations are all that remain of a city that once included six general stores, saloons and hotels.
- **S6** Okanogan Historical Museum Explore the museum artifacts of early ranches, schools, and pioneers of the Okanogan Valley, stroll through an outdoor village, and visit a fire engine at the old Fire Station. If you want more details, the Wilson Research Center is part of this set of buildings.
- **S7 St. Mary's Mission** First church in Okanogan County. Paschal Sherman school was founded by the church, and is still in existence.
- S8 Old Molson Ghost Town & Museum

WILDLIFE AREAS

WI Sinlahekin Wildlife Area − 5 miles S of Loomis or 4.5 miles NE of Conconully. This wildlife area is open to the public for wildlife viewing, fishing, hunting, hiking and boating. Features: 14,000 acres managed for wildlife habitat and wildlife-oriented recreation. The area has 5 lakes, all undeveloped; primitive campsites, some with accessible toilets and cooking grills. Seasonal wildlife viewing possible from car. In 1957, eighteen California Bighorn Sheep were transplanted to the Sinlahekin Wildlife Area in an effort to reintroduce bighorn sheep to Washington. The effort, along with additional subsequent introductions, have been successful, resulting in reestablishment of bighorn sheep populations to the Sinlahekin.

W2 Tunk Creek Wildlife Area – 12 miles NE of Omak. This 1,080 acre area is managed primarily to protect critical sharp-tailed grouse habitat. The area also supports mule deer, ruffed grouse, quail, and gray partridge as well as many non-game species. Deer hunting is very popular in the area.

W3 Scotch Creek Wildlife Area – 10 miles west of Omak and Okanogan on Conconully HWY. The area encompasses a total of 9,067 acres in three separate parcels referred to as the Scotch Creek, Mineral Hill, and Pogue Mountain Units. The area was purchased primarily for the purpose of protecting critical sharp-tailed grouse habitat. There have been four leks (grouse dancing grounds) documented in the Wildlife Area.

Aeneas Lake - 3.5 miles S of Tonasket. Rainbow and brown trout. Fly-fishing only. No motors.

Blue Lake – Sinlahekin Wildlife Area. Rainbow and brown trout. Gravel parking area. Boat launch. Primitive camp sites. Check fishing regulations.

Bonaparte Lake - 26 miles E of Tonasket on Hwy. 20, 6 mi. N on FS 4953. Rainbow, brook, lake trout and kokanee. Campground with fishing platform. Resort. **Chopaka Lake** - 2.1 miles N of Loomis, 1.4 miles W on Chopaka Lake Road, 5.1 miles N on steep one-lane road, E. 2 miles Trout. Campground with picnic shelters. **Conconully Lake** - $\frac{1}{4}$ mile E of Conconully. Rainbow trout and bass. Boat launch with public restrooms. Resort.

Conconully Reservoir $-\frac{1}{4}$ mile S of Conconully. Rainbow trout and kokanee. Boat launch with public restrooms. State Park with camping and picnic areas. Resorts.

Fish Lake – Sinlahekin Wildlife Area. Rainbow trout. Boat launches. Primitive campsites. Toilets.

Forde Lake – Sinlahekin Wildlife Area. Wild brook trout. Boat launch. Gravel parking lot. Primitive campsites.

Green Lakes – 5 miles NW of Omak. Rainbow trout. Winter season:

Dec. I - March 31. Catch-and-release for other seasons. Check fishing regulations.

Leader Lake – 8.4 miles W on Hwy. 20 from junction with Hwy. 97, 0.4 mile N on Leader Lake Road. Trout and bass. Campsites and picnic area. Fishing platform.

Osoyoos Lake – ¼ miles N of Oroville on Hwy. 97. Boat launches. City Park with camping and picnic areas, swimming.

Palmer Lake – 4.5 miles N of Loomis. Boat launch. Resorts.

Sidley Lake -5 miles E of Oroville on Chesaw Road, 2 miles N on Molson Road. Rainbow trout. Year-round fishing.

Spectacle Lake – 12 miles NW of Tonasket. Rainbow trout. Public access. Resorts. **Wannacut Lake** – 6 miles SW of Oroville. Rainbow Trout. Public access. Resort.

Whitestone Lake – 8.1 miles N of Tonasket on 4th St. and Hwy. 7.

Check fishing rules. Gravel and black-top parking.

Osoyoos Lake Veteran's Memorial Park – Located ¼ mile north of Oroville, WA., near the Canadian border. From Canada: Travel south on Hwy. 97. The park is on the left across from Prince's Department Store, just north of Oroville. From the south: Travel north on Hwy. 97. Pass through Oroville, and look for the park on the right, across from Prince's Department Store. Beach access. Reservation Phone: (509) 476-3321.

HIKES

HI Similkameen Trail • 8 mi round trip from Oroville VIC; an easy hike. A railtrail with opportunities for biking, hiking, birding, wildlife, wildflowers, river views, salmon viewing, photography, waterfall, and history. If you want an urban trail this one has it all. A 375-foot bridge above the river provides excellent viewing for salmon & steelhead runs.

H2 Whistler Canyon • On HWY 97, 14 mi N of Tonasket, 3 mi S of Oroville. Several loop & spur trails offer short day hikes to extended hikes, horseback riding and rock climbing opportunities. This 12-mile trail is part of the Pacific Northwest National Scenic Trail & connects to the Wilcox Mountain trailhead. Choose from a short hike of a couple hours round trip on the Frog Pond Trail, a half day hike to Black Diamond Lake, or a 24-mile roundtrip.

H3 McLaughlin Canyon Trail • 4 mi S of Tonasket, take McLaughlin Canyon Rd for three miles to trailhead on north side of road. The trail heads down the South Canyon. Used by the Hudson's Bay Company in the early 1800's, it became known as the Caribou Trail during the Gold Rush in the 1850's. Today it is an easy 3 mile round trip.

H4 Island Trail • This easy day hike offers a rare opportunity to experience the deserts river habitat. Built and maintained by Okanogan High School Students.
